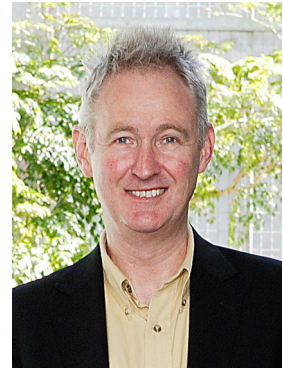

Profile

Graeme has been a director of the practice since 1981, and has played a leading role in establishing the company's design reputation.

For the five years 1990-95, Graeme was the ASC director in charge of the National Bank refurbishment programme which involved work on 180 sites nationwide and over \$150m. The biggest individual contract in the programme was the \$13m refurbishment of National Bank House, Wellington. During this time, he also worked on the design of Ronald McDonald House, Queen Elizabeth Square refurbishment and a new clinic for Auckland Eye in Remuera.

Current work is a mix of work for councils, corporations, urban design projects and medium density housing. Several projects for local councils are in progress, and Graeme is regularly consulted by Auckland City Council on urban design matters.

Recently he has overseen the completion of design and documentation of the McDonald's headquarters in Auckland, as well as some high profile projects for Auckland City and Franklin District Councils. These include the Onehunga Library and Community Centre, a conservation centre at Auckland Zoo, and the Franklin Library and Arts Centre.

Also, over the last 10 years, Graeme has been involved in numerous high-profile interior design projects, and has received several NZIA design awards for a winery, houses and interiors.

He has a strong interest in design in a New Zealand context and was convener of the National Awards for Architecture for the New Zealand Institute of Architects in 1994 and 1995. He was a member of the NZIA Council and the honorary secretary for four years 1996 to 1999, and is currently chairman of the NZIA Urban Issues Group.

Graeme has received the NZIA President's Award three times for services to the profession.
